## What is Servant Leadership?



- 10.Building community.









Now that you have taken those great pictures of the foliage, what do you do about the leaves that are now sitting on your lawn or in the back yard? Leaves don't have to end up in trash bags or in burn piles. If you look at them as a "gift from nature" there are several ways you can beautify your home in an environmentally and friendly way. Without going into a deep discussion about how to do each (information can be found on the internet or at your town recycling department), here are some ideas for dealing with your leaves:

<u>Compost piles</u>- mix shredded leaves (use your lawnmower) with grass clippings and deposit in a corner, add new clipping underneath the old and cover in late fall. Spring will bring a nice pile of compost for all your plantings.

<u>Mulching</u>- collect leaves and chop them up with your lawnmower- add some woodchips and grass clippings and cover your flower and plant beds. Mulch is for protection so remove when mulch gets old and replace with fresh.

<u>Leaves as Fireplace Fuel</u>: fill a bag with dry leaves, along with any twigs you may find, store in a cool dry place- use a handful in your wood-burning fireplace for a quick start and a delicious aroma

<u>Leaves as Natural Decorations</u>: use them in art projects and fun indoor crafts for your children. Frame the most colorful leaves or use them to decorate a scarecrow in your yard. Finally, add a cinnamon stick to some dry leaves and put in a mesh bag for an instant sachet of fall scents.

Are you curious about the life of a guide dog? Do you imagine it's all strict discipline and no excitement? Because a working dog should not be distracted from its work, no one but the handler should touch it, speak to it or even make prolonged eye contact with it (by way of explanation, prolonged eye contact is the same as speaking to a dog). People often assume that since <a href="text-y">text-y</a> can't pat the dog, no one (including the handler) ever pats the dog. This is far from the truth. The bond between my dog and me strengthens every time I praise her, every time I tell her how much I love her and what a great dog she is. When my dog is off-duty at home, she frolics just as any other dog with impeccable manners will. She barks at "intruders" or any other surprising events. And she plays with me (and the cat) and gets belly rubs and hugs and pats and treats. It's a wonderful life.

Onchocerciasis, also known as river blindness, is a parasitic disease that afflicts the rural poor. It is caused by a worm that is spread from person to person through the bites of Simulium black flies that breed in rapid-flowing rivers and streams. The disease can cause intense itching, eye damage, and irreversible blindness, reducing an individual's ability to work and learn. Worldwide, an estimated 120 million are at risk of being infected and 270,000 have been blinded by the disease, mostly in Africa.

Since 1993, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has awarded more than US\$33 million to support the distribution of river blindness medicine, Mectizan®, to approximately 251 million people in 15 African and Latin American countries. SightFirst has worked in close partnership since 1999 with The Carter Center—a leader in the fight to end river blindness.

On September 29, 2016, Guatemala's minister of health, Dr. Lucrecia Hernandez Mack, announced that the World Health Organization (WHO) has officially verified the elimination of onchocerciasis from Guatemala. Guatemala is now the fourth country in the Americas to be verified free of this disease, after Colombia (2013), Ecuador (2014), and Mexico (2015).

Please consider making a donation to LCIF's sight programs so that we may continue to fight preventable blindness.
