



The Epping Lions Club will be hosting the 43rd annual Lamprey River Canoe & Kayak Race on Saturday, April 25th, 2020. The race takes place on the wild and scenic Lamprey River. The race is approximately 7.3 miles long, beginning at Mary Blair Park on Rt. 27 in Epping and ending downriver at the trail-landing near the Rt. 87 bridge. Registration begins at 8am and the race begins promptly at 9am. Categories for the race are: Male Solo, Female Solo, 2-person. Prizes will be awarded to the first, second and third place finishers in each category.

Race t-shirts will be available for sale. Race is run rain or shine, so come prepared! All entrants must wear a life preserver (no exceptions!). This race has been a staple in the community for over 40 years. The Lions took over the race from the Conservation Commission in 2009. Many entrants are familiar faces year after year and friendly rivalries continue after each running.








Happy Birthday, Rosie!!


