Whether making masks, collecting food and funds for our food pantries, or helping friends, family and neighbors who aren't able to go to the grocery store or pharmacies. It is so encouraging to see our Lions continue to Serve their communities. There is a light at the end of the tunnel and it burns bright because of you!

Our May convention date has been canceled due to the Covid-19 crisis, however we have set a date and location to hold a one day event to end our year on a positive note. It will be held June 28th at the Double Tree in Nashua. The registration form is included in this month's newsletter and that you will consider joining us.

We have established via LCI guidelines a plan to hold our elections for our incoming District officers which does need to occur in May. Ballots have been sent to the clubs for distribution to their delegates. We will be counting the ballots on May 12th either in person or virtually. Most likely virtually.

To date LCIF has issued Grants totaling \$2.4 million to countries around the world who are struggling to meet the demands that Covid-19 has placed on their populations. Now is the time for us to help others who are suffering from this situation. Thank you for whatever your clubs can donate.

We are still working on the" Be the Match" program. It will run until mid-May. We have included the QR code for our District so that you can share it via email with friends, family (children and grandchildren) and co-workers. 

Moultonborough Lions Club members Pete Strople and Don Trudeau packed their vehicles to the brim with 10,000 individually wrapped meals for delivery to the local communities. In March the Moultonborough Lions had recruited over 50 members of the community to come together to form assembly lines to package the 10,000 individually wrapped meals. A project like this had never been attempted before in this area and yet it was received with so much enthusiasm. Lions Peter Allen, Pete Strople, Dawn Law, Sally Sibulkin, Don Trudeau, and Michelle Duddy were able to deliver the boxes of food. There were 216 meals in each box. They were donated to Bridge House in Plymouth, Belknap House in Laconia, the Tamworth Food Pantry in Meredith, the Meredith Emergency Food Pantry, Meals on Wheels in Moultonborough, both inter-lakes and Moultonborough School District (to be handed out with the free breakfast and lunch meals distributed to students), and Isaiah 61 Café in Laconia.



Plaistow is working with the school nurse who has reached out to the Pollard Elementary school families that participate in the Power Packs (68 hrs.) during the school year and we have set up weekly deliveries where the food is dropped off at the front door. They are notified prior to the delivery. There has been a big outpouring of support to help those in need so we have setup a weekly food drive to help support the program. Along with our normal shopping trips to the store to fill the shelves. People wanting to donate drive to our club meeting spot and a volunteer will come and retrieve the donation from the persons vehicle. Currently we are supporting 30 kids on a weekly basis. Instead of giving a pack with seven meals we are providing a box of food with more items. In some cases there might be a family with 4 kids at different grade levels.

COVID-19 AND DIABETES

Everyone needs to be careful to avoid the coronavirus that causes COVID-19. If you have type 1 or type 2 diabetes, you should be ever more cautious.

Your risk of catching the virus isn't higher than anyone else's. But you could have worse complications if you do get sick. That's especially true if your diabetes isn't well-controlled.

To reduce your chances of getting infected:

- Keep your distance from other people (at least 6 feet away)
- Use good hygiene (wash hand with soap and water for at least 20 seconds)
- Keep your blood sugar under control.
- Stock up on enough goods to last you for a couple of weeks, in case you get quarantined.
- Healthy carbs like whole-wheat crackers, vegetables or noodle soups, and unsweetened applesauce
- Simple carbs like honey, sugar-sweetened soda, fruit juice, or hard candies in case your blood sugar dips
- The maximum number of refills you can get of your insulin and other medications
- Extra glucagon and ketone strips

CHILDHOOD CANCER



As we are experiencing having to stay at home and avoiding close contact with people, I wondered how this affects children with cancer. I found the following on St Jude's website:

Are Children at Higher Risk for COVID-19?

"No. In fact, children seem to be at lower risk for serious illness due to COVID-19. This is based on initial results from other countries. This does not mean that children don't get COVID-19. But the risk of severe illness in children is generally lower.

Based on what is currently known, the highest risk for complications with COVID-19 is seen in older adults and patients with chronic health problems such as heart disease, diabetes, lung problems, or people with weak immune systems.

Families with children who have weakened immune systems due to an illness or medical condition should take extra care to prevent exposure to the virus. If symptoms develop, contact your doctor right away."

This is some "good news" from current knowledge of those children with cancer that are vulnerable to Covid-19. For those of us who are "older adults" we need to continue to minimize our exposure to others. It is difficult to have to stay at home, for me I am used to being out usually 4 nights a week for meetings and doing things with friends. I commented to someone the other day, if this is what retirement is like I'll pass on it. Stay at home, stay safe, and I look forward to seeing everyone in June.

District 44-H Lions Club Combating Hunger in Their Communities

Hampstead Lions have made two monetary donations to the Saint Anne's food Pantry. First was \$500.00. Second Donation was for \$2,000.00. Our Easter Pancake Breakfast was cancelled so the pancake mix, maple syrup and sausages that were purchased for the event have been donated and were split between the Saint Anne's Food Pantry and Sandown Food Pantry.

Hampton contributed \$700 to the End 68 hrs. of Hunger, and that several of us are buying groceries for neighbors, or cooking meals for Family Promise and for a friend of Lions who lost her husband last week, we are all staying within our homes.

Nashua Lions Club had given \$1000. To the 68 Hours of Hunger for their fundraising efforts. We also gave \$500 to the Nashua Soup Kitchen and Shelter to get them started on their annual fundraiser. We usually donate to the race they put on but couldn't this year. Anyway that's what happening in Nashua!

Windham donated \$500.00 to Shepherd's Pantry (our local food pantry) last week and some of our members have purchased and donated food to our pantry.



Hudson Lions Club donated \$2,000 to the food pantry which is headed up by Lion Pauline Boisvert. All distributions are done outside as no one is allowed in the food pantry. Boxes of food are brought outside. Cars line up across the street and are let into the yard a few at a time. No one is allowed out of their cars, no windows rolled down. Clients are warned to have their trunk cleaned as large boxes of food are placed in their trunk. They are provided with canned goods, dairy, deli, desserts, meats and breads.

The pantry continues to work with the "Feed Our Kids" program at local schools to provide children in need with their own personal bag of food that contains drinks, snacks, peanut butter, can of soup, can of spaghetti product, tuna, chicken, mac & cheese some breakfast items and other easy meals for a child to be able to prepare on their own. These are being given out at Memorial School where most Hudson school children are now picking up their lunches. Luc's restaurant, T-Bones and Donna's place restaurant are contributing. Our local Fire Dept., Police Dept. and town officials also work along with Hudson Lions Club Members.

Lions Sight & Hearing Foundation

We are still in uncharted waters with COVID – 19 that none of us have faced before. MCC Fred Plett set up Go to Meeting for the Multi District us to use so I scheduled our April meeting for the Sight & Hearing Foundation. I hung one of the S&H Banners behind me and at 6:30 we began gathering for our second meeting. Those giving reports had sent them via email prior to the meeting so all of us were working off the same pages that the presenters were using which, of course, worked great.

The meeting was well attended. Following the agenda, we moved ahead – Secretaries report was presented by SVDG Virginia Edwards verbally as she was disconnected at the March meeting thus needing to check with the board to complete the minutes to be presented at our next meeting. Treasurer MCC Fred Plett reviewed his report and answered questions by board members. He pointed out The Covid 19 crisis is impacting our endowment big time. Let's hope it is a V shaped recovery. As of 3/31 our endowment was at \$829,920 after surpassing \$1 million earlier in the year. He also, stressed that we should not panic as projections are that in time the market will come back. I called for a roll call vote, so all were able to hear the votes taken. Lion John Wynne presented his internal audit report finding that the treasurer records were in order.

PCC Roger LaTulippe reported on the Granite State Fellow program. He filled nine requests in March and six so far this month. There have been 487 GSF awards and 26 Progressive GSF awards presented since the program's inception.

Next Lion Alan Hoye presented one project. That was approved with a roll call vote. He noted that there was only one case to present as two are being processed and with the current situation it is taking longer to get the information needed, He also suspects that the same is happening on the club level to complete applications for submission which will reduce number of cases to be presented and acted on by the Board.

The Stand-up Comedy Team reported progress is being made and considering the current situation the committee may recommend changes in the future. The nomination committee made a report in preparation of presenting a slate of officers for the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 pm
