


Some ideas to help along these lines are to hold a food drive. The post office usually does one Mother's Day weekend and didn't this year. Recently my club held a drive at our Dollar Tree. I know Plaistow and Atkinson also did one recently. We checked with the manager. She was thrilled. We put it out on Facebook only, put a table out about us on Saturday from 8-2 and collected 886 lbs. of food and \$142. We handed out little slips of paper with food and toiletry items and people were very generous. They were happy to help. Everyone wore masks and safe distanced but our name got out there.

Be thinking about doing the community needs assessment in your town. Contact the police, fireman, school district, senior center, day cares and Boy's and Girls Clubs to see what they might need. I'm assuming we will be wearing masks for a long time. Think about how you can get them out in the community.

Seek out new members and listen to their fresh ideas. Remember we have 5 initiatives that we work on. Hunger, vision, environment, diabetes, and childhood cancer. You can still clean up an area for the environment or plant some flowers. World wide diabetes day is in November so you can begin to think about working on that.


