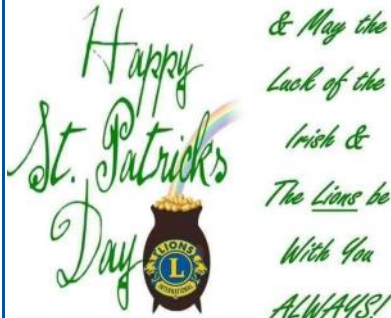

Dear Lions of MD44

Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although we are disappointed that we won't be able to host this event in person, we are excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We are still finalizing the details of your new convention experience, and will share those with you as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention we'd like to share with you:

- **Everyone's invited** – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.
- **Registration fees** – The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then US\$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be US\$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.
- **Current registrants** – Lions who are currently registered for convention will receive an email soon with more information about their registration options.
- **Elections** – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be forthcoming.
- **Convention updates** – Check our convention website LCICon for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time for our organization and the world, and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

President Al Goldstein welcomed John Bayliss coming on board as a 44N Director.

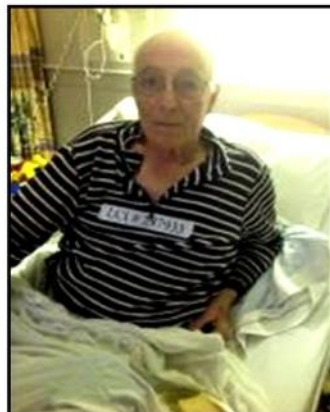

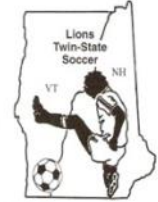

Last month I mentioned the case of the mom with a 4 year old boy who is autistic and nonverbal. In order to get mom the iPad and Apple gift card to download the program, the BOD of LSHF voted by email to expedite the case. Project chair Dan Diemand and I delivered said items to her on Feb. 6, 2021. You would of thought it was Christmas again when she received the items.

We got to close out another item that started back last fall with the Fuel Medical Group. This is a support group out of Washington state that offers holistic audio logic and business support to ensure and strengthen the future of private practice ownership. The Chelmsford Hearing Group reached out to us and asked if we could pick up and recycle hearing aids they collected from their clients. After several attempts, we finally connected with Dr. Katie Harrington on February 9, 2021 to collect said items. Now this leads me to say, that the Hampton Club collects used hearing aids along with eye glasses that we traditionally donate at the mid-winter convention. Club President Christine Gies met me at the Old Salt on Thursday February 18th to receive the hearing aids. Now I'll make a pitch for the club—I know some clubs already donate funds to help the Hampton club with the shipping costs for the eye glasses. I am asking for the rest of you to consider doing the same. Doesn't need to be big, a little will help.

Last, I still get phone calls from people who want to know how to apply for assistance with their cases. Always glad to help, but remember you can go to the web site to see the club request for assistance form, and the application for the client to fill out. Go to www.nhlions.org and click onto the Sight and Hearing site. You will see what you need. Also, Dan Diemand is the project chair. His address is correctly listed with a Newton NH address—not Plaistow.

Reminder—some clubs have money that is in the Granite State Fellow account. You invested that and have not used it. Consider doing so to recognize someone in the community or your club.

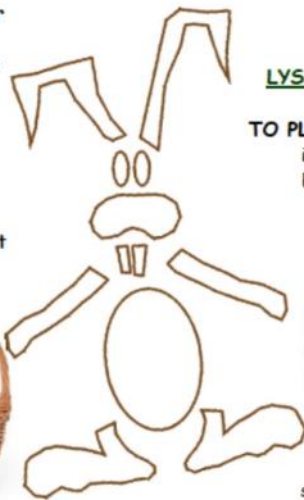
